As then-Senator Obama observed in a 2008 speech in Philadelphia, "segregated schools were, and are, inferior schools 50 years after *Brown v. Board of Education* – and the inferior education they provided, then and now, helps explain the pervasive achievement gap between today's black and white students."

### **What Was Brown V. Board Of Education? | NAACP Legal ...**

On May 17, 1954, U.S. Supreme Court Justice Earl Warren delivered the unanimous ruling in the landmark civil rights case *Brown v. Board of Education of Topeka, Kansas*. State-sanctioned segregation of public schools was a violation of the 14th amendment and was therefore unconstitutional. This historic decision marked the end of the "separate but equal" precedent set by the Supreme Court nearly 60 years earlier in *Plessy v.*

### **Our Documents - Brown v. Board of Education (1954)**

Facts of the case. This case was the consolidation of cases arising in Kansas, South Carolina, Virginia, Delaware, and Washington D.C. relating to the segregation of public schools on the basis of race. In each of the cases, African American students had been denied admittance to certain public schools based on laws allowing public education to be segregated by race.
